Course Description

Jesus lived the most impactful life in all of history. This course takes students through the key events in Jesus's life and includes a companion website with over 200 additional interactive learning resources. Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, you should be able to:

- Have a basic understanding of who Jesus and the four gospel writers were.
- Explain the beginning of Jesus's life on earth.
- Identify key people and events that pointed to the birth of the promised Savior.
- Understand why God sent Jesus to earth.
- Explain Jesus's temptation, His miracles, and His power to forgive sins.
- Explain Jesus's teachings about Himself, about life here on earth, and about eternal life.
- Identify the events of Passion Week and the events immediately preceding.
- Understand the events of Jesus's resurrection and His last days on earth, the gifting of the Holy Spirit, and the beginning of the early church.
- Explain Jesus's teachings about eternal life with God.

Course Methods

Throughout this course, a number of methods will be used to engage you in understanding, processing and applying the information learned in this course to your life. These methods include the following:

- **Video-based teaching**
The primary teaching session in each lesson is provided in video format. If you do not have the bandwidth required to view the video, we provide the option of listening to the lesson or reading the lesson from a transcript.

- **Additional Resources**

Lessons may be accompanied by additional readings, images, etc. that you can use to supplement your learning.

Course Requirements
