Williams, George H. *The Radical Reformation*, 2nd edition 1992 (Westminster Press, Phila. PA). *The book, however, is too long and too unwieldy though it covers everything. Better to be used as a reference book along with the 5 vol Mennonite Encyclopedia (Scottsdale, PA, Herald Press).*

Clasen, Claus-Peter. *Anabaptism. A Social History*. (Ithaca, NY. Cornell University Press, 1972). *A social history that consciously rejects an intellectual approach. Not suitable for church history.*

Littell, Franklin H. *The Origins of Sectarian Protestantism*. (Macmillan, 1964). *Does not cover everything. Was originally published as a study of the Anabaptist view of the church.*

Davis, Kenneth R. *Anabaptism and Asceticism*. (Scottsdale, PA, Herald Press, 1974). *Pursues a thesis and is not a text.*

Estep, Wm. R. *The Anabaptist Story*, revised edition. (Grand Rapids, MI, Eerdmans, 1975).

Dyck, C. J., ed. *An Introduction to Mennonite History*. (Scottsdale, PA, Herald Press, 1981). *Has a good, though brief, introduction to the subject.*

Krahn, Cornelius. *Dutch Anabaptism*. (The Hague, 1968). *Indispensable for the Dutch scene, but not a text.*

Burrage, Henry S. *A History of the Anabaptists in Switzerland*. (B. Franklin Reprint, 1973, New York). *A work from the turn of the century by a Baptist historian and still very useful, though does not cover everything and is not a text.*

Friedmann, Robert S. *The Theology of Anabaptism*. (Scottsdale, PA, Herald Press, 1973). *Useful for theology, but not a history.*

Moore, John Allen. *Anabaptist Portraits*. (Scottsdale, PA. Herald Press, 1984). *A collection of biographical sketches.*

Goertz, Hans-Juergen, ed. *Profiles of Radical Reformers*. (Scottsdale, PA. Herald Press, 1988). *Profiles done by experts in the field of 21 prominent radical reformers.*

Williams, George H. and Angel M. Mergal, eds. *Spirit and Anabaptist Writers*. (Phila. PA. The Westminster Press, 1957).

Original documents with a good introduction.

Klaassen, Walter, ed. *Anabaptism in Outline*. (Herald Press, Scottdale, PA. 1981).

A good collection of original sources covering all the relevant topics.
